Occupation Description:

Panelbeaters repair damage to metal, fibreglass and plastic body work on vehicles, and form replacement vehicle panels.



Their job involves:

- › removing damaged panels and parts, and removing upholstery and accessories to gain access
- › removing dents by hammering panels
- › straightening damaged vehicles and parts using mechanical and hydraulic equipment
- › replacing badly damaged sections with new or second-hand panels
- › filling depressions with plastic filler and filing grinding and sanding repaired surfaces
- › cutting and joining replacement sections using welding equipment
- › fitting repaired or replacement panels on vehicles and refitting body hardware such as door locks and trims.

Panelbeaters may also:

- › assist vehicle body builders in constructing and restoring custom-designed, vintage and other specialty vehicles
- › spray-paint vehicles

How will I be assessed?

Stage 1: Documentary Evidence Assessment

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What skills and knowledge do I need?

The qualification relevant to this occupation is the **AUR32120 Certificate III in Automotive Body Repair Technology**.

To be awarded this qualification, you must demonstrate your skills and knowledge in the units of competency listed in the table below. Each unit of competency defines a selection of knowledge and skills required in Australian workplaces.

You must achieve 31 units of competency:

> 17 core units

> 14 elective units.

- › An Australian Certificate III qualification and a Statement of Results.

If you are *unsuccessful* in Stage 2 you will receive:

- › A Skills Assessment Result Letter.

And if applying under Pathway 1:

- › A Statement of Attainment that lists the units of competency you have successfully achieved
- › A Statement of Results that lists the units of competency you have successfully achieved and those that were not achieved.
